SEEING OPPORTUNITY

38% of children in Leeds live in poverty, correlating to a university access rate of 15%, 33% below the national average. With a high school drop out rate increasing.

Entrepreneurship education is not part of the UK curriculum despite increasing opportunities in that area.

TAKING ACTION

Inspiring You, with the help of 'Societies into Schools', runs workshops for year 5 and 6 students in Leeds to inspire them to explore different career opportunities and pursue further education. As well as introduce them to the concept of entrepreneurship.

The 2 hour workshops consists of having the children make vision boards of how they envision their future. We then we introduce to them the idea of enterprise through an interactive activity. This consists of our volunteers acting as suppliers - trading building blocks to students for fake money. They then make a product out of them and pitch it to the other students to buy.

ENABLING PROGRESS

Now that the foundations have been laid via extensive changes to the content provided, greater emphasis is being put onto building a mentoring programme with individuals in the schools we visit to create long lasting relationships.

SEEING OPPORTUNITY

10 million tonnes of food is waste in the UK annually, equating to £17 billion worth of food lost to landfill, and 20 million tonnes greenhouse gases

250,000 tonnes of that food is still edible and could help feed the 8.4 million people in the UK

TAKING ACTION

Revive holds a weekly stall at the student Union where students and visitors can buy fresh fruits and vegetables on a “pay as you feel” basis. These are sourced from the Real Junkfood Project and would otherwise be sent to landfill.

Customers are also educated on food waste issues and sustainable living.

ENABLING PROGRESS

A lot of refugees can't legally work once they get to the UK. As a way to provide them with valuable work and business experience, we are currently in contact with two charities to have volunteers run the stall on a part time basis.

Enterprise Advisory Thinktank helps empower local enterprises by offering unique, bespoke solutions to tackle key challenges they face, paving the way to new opportunities for long term growth. Currently working with 1 social enterprise: 'Bloomin Buds Theatre'.
